#### Local News: Saturday Night Art Walk

Get ready for the upcoming spring festivities by enjoying a leisurely stroll through downtown Covington on Saturday night. Several art galleries will be staying open late with special events. The St. Tammany Art Association is opening its "Engagement" show, starting at 6pm. Fielding Gallery will have live music by Timothy AG. Three Rivers Gallery and Tripolo Gallery will be also be open for the evening.

#### John Wharton Collins

Covington was originally founded as the Town of Wharton on July 4, 1813 by John Wharton Collins. He laid the town out in its unique pattern of squares within squares (ox lots), which were accessed by alleyways. Collins named the town's center the Division of St. John. It is this unique design which was largely responsible for placement of the Division of St. John on the National Register of Historic Places in 1981. The town was formally incorporated in 1816 by the state legislature and renamed Covington. John Wharton Collins is buried in Covington Cemetery No. 1, facing City Hall at the corner of N. Columbia and Kirkland Street.



#### Wildlife Lookout: Common Woodpeckers in Southern Louisiana





The Red-Headed Woodpecker is similar in size to the Red-Bellied and is often mistaken for the other. Note that the red on this bird covers its entire head. These birds often flycatch and can be spotted swooping low to catch insects.

The Pileated Woodpecker is the largest of the North American woodpeckers at 17". Despite its size this elegant bird is quite shy and is usually not observed in residential areas. Its presence is most easily detected by it's loud, ringing call and its large characteristically rectangular excavations in trees.



#### Farmer's Market Recipes

Fresh recipes inspired by ingredients found at the Covington Farmer's Market, by Chef Sorelli

#### Farmer's Market Veggie Lasagna

Collect:



Turnips (Father and Son Produce) Carrots (Bartlett Farms) Favorite Greens (Grow Farms) Shiitakes (Betty Rue)

2 Containers of Sundried Tomato Pesto (Nur's Kitchen) 1 Bag of Spinach dved Lasagna Sheets (Sorelli's at the Market)

2 Containers of Feta (Jeanie Simmons)

Heat oven to 350 and put on a 6 quart pot of salted water for the pasta. Peel and cut up vegetables. Cook veggies separately so the lasagna will cook evenly. Heat a skillet and add oil. Salt and pepper the turnips, then saute until golden; follow same procedure for carrots and shiitakes. Cook off the pasta and set on top of a bowl with light ice to cool the sheets. Lightly oil the pasta so it will not stick. Spread sundried tomato pesto in a 9x11 baking dish. Layer the vegetables evenly across the bottom, then crumble feta across evenly. Add lasagna sheets in a single layer across top. Repeat steps, and on final top layer, spread pesto and crumble feta on top. Gently push air out of layers. Bake for about 45 minutes, or until bubbly and melted.





#### Pet Care: Nail Trimming

Keeping your pet's nails trimmed is important if they do not walk on surfaces that will naturally wear them down. In general, dog nails are more important to keep up with than cat nails; cats have etractable claws and are able to hone them. Any cat owner can tell you the benefits of trimming off those needle sharp points, however. Dog nails, if left unchecked, can grow back into the pad, causing discomfort and possible health issues.

It is important not to cut the "quick" when nail trimming. The quick is the fleshy part that grows about halfway down the inside of the nail, usually pinkish in color. If you are unsure about how to trim your pet's nails, ask for a demonstration by your veterinarian or groomer. They can show you the appropriate place to trim without harming your pet. Most clinics and groomers offer a nail trim with bathing services for a small fee.
