

## Making an Organic Pest-Repellant

Pesticides are a fairly new concept, originating in the aftermath of WWII. In most cases, harmful pests can be controlled by companion planting, catering to 'good bugs' and keeping plants that ward off pests, like merigold. In those instances where they just seem to take over it is always good to have a back-up plan. There is a large selection of organic pest-repellant recipes that you can make from things found around the house. An online search will pull up many, and there are plenty of books on the subject. We have pulled our favorite all-purpose recipe as an example, but it is important to test multiple recipes to find which ones are right for which plants. Remember to test these sprays on a couple of leaves, watching how they react after two or three days before spraying the whole plant.

1/2 cup of hot pepper of your choice, chopped 1/2 cup of garlic, chopped 2 cups of water




1 covered container and 1 spray bottle

## Farmer's Market Recipes

Fresh recipes inspired by ingredients found at the Covington Farmer's Market, by Chef Sorelli

## **Smoked Chicken Tacos**

- 1 whole chicken (G F Farms)
- 1 container of red salsa
- 1 container of green salsa
- l bag of tortillas (7 grain) 1 container of feta cheese torte (Jeanie Simmons)
- 1 bag of pink salt (Betty Rue)

The night before cooking, we are going to make a brine for the chicken using the pink salt. The purpose of a brine is to moisten the meat by hydrating the cells of the muscle tissue. Begin by boiling 2 cups water and 2 cups pink salt. Once the salt is dissolved, add about 4 cups of ice. Add the cooled brine to the chicken and let set over night. On the following day, start your smoker with your favorite wood chips like apple hickory. Prep the chicken by covering with a quarter cup of the red salsa on top and around the chicken. Your chicken should take about 2 hours to cook. Once it is cooked, pull the meat off the chicken so that it is shredded. Now warm the tortillas in the oven or pan and build the tacos. On the base, lay the chicken down first, then spread both salsas accordingly and crumble the feta


