### The Eastern Lubber Grasshopper

The Eastern Lubber grasshopper is native to the southeastern and south central portion of the United States. It is the most distinctive grasshopper species within the southeastern U.S., well known for its size and unique coloration. In the nymph stage, the lubber is wingless and completely black with yellow, orange or red stripes. Adults reach about 3 inches and grow wings half the length of their body. The coloration may change to dull yellow with black spots and markings, bright orange with black markings, or entirely black with yellow or red striping.

In Louisiana, Mississippi and Alabama, the lubber is sometimes referred to as the Devil's Horse. Forms of defense the lubber exhibits include the brightly colored warning pattern, loud hissing sounds, and a foul-smelling and foul-tasting foamy secretion from the thorax. The lubber's wings cannot be used for flight, and they are restricted to jumping short distances.

### Farmer's Market Recipes

Fresh recipes inspired by ingredients found at the Covington Farmer's Market, by Chef Leslie "Sorelli" Guy

### Summer Chicken Salad

- 1 whole chicken (G F Farms)
- 1 pint of blueberries (Miller's Peach Farm)
- l container of skordalia (Theresa Italian Cookies)
- 1 bunch of green onions (The Garden John Bartlet)
- 1 loaf of French baguettes (Windfield Farms)

Begin by boiling or baking the chicken (whichever you prefer) until it is cooked. Once the chicken is cooked, set aside and allow it to cool. Next, begin to clean blueberries and green onions. Dice the green onions very fine and slice the blueberries in half. Pull the chicken and either chop by hand or chop in the food processor (for a very fine cut). Mix all the ingredients in a bowl and add the skordalia. Salt and pepper to taste and mix well. Now it is time to spoon onto the baguette and enjoy!

The Covington Farmer's Market is every Saturday from 8-12 at the 600 block of Columbia Street, and every Wednesday at the Covington Trailhead from 10 - 2, rain or shine.


