Voice St. Tammany Back For Third Season



onion, bell pepper, garlic and ginger in 1 tablespoon of butter with a little salt and cayenne. In another pan cook the slightly scrambled eggs in the other tablespoon of butter, stirring them often to keep them fluffy. Add the sliced radish, carrots, tomato, peas, broccoli, bell pepper and onion to the sauteed veggies and stir. Add the rice, broth, soy or amino, vinegar and oil, and stir some more, cooking on medium high. The eggs should be well cooked at this time, add this too. Do a little more stirring. Add a little more salt, cayenne and hot red pepper sauce to taste. Stir a bit more until all is well mixed. Serve with grated radish and carrots, green onion and some crushed peanuts.
