

"Icons: Personal Visions" Exhibition At STAA

Byzantium To The American South + New Members' Show

Now through January 25, art lovers can see an exciting show at the St. Tammany Art Association called Icons: Personal Visions. The show features ten Southeastern Louisiana artists who take a broader, secular approach to traditional icon imagery and processes, literally expressed by some and ambiguously approached by others.

On January 11th from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m., the public is invited to delve more deeply into this show with an exploration of the topic Byzantium to the American South and the migration of icons and iconography from the Thomas Mann, a featured religious to the secular in contemporary art.

The program begins with an overview of the history of the icon presented by Francie Rich, MFA, artist/educator, who currently teaches art history and appreciation at St. Scholastica Academy and St. Joseph Abbey Seminary College. Rich and husband, Louisiana artist/educator John Hodge, MFA, conduct international tours focusing on visual arts. Then, at 4:00 p.m., New Orleans Museum of Art Curator of Contemporary Art, Miranda Lash, leads an informal discussion with artists in the exhibition on their art and ideas relating to "icons" in contemporary art making.

The afternoon conversations will be followed at 6:00 p.m. by an opening reception "new selections for the new year" in the Members' Gallery, with works on display January 11 through February 22, 2014.

Icons: Personal Visions features the work of Jacqueline Bishop, Douglas Bourgeois, Alan Gerson, Jessica Goldfinch, Christopher Guarisco, John Hodge, Thomas Mann, Francie Rich, Leslie Staub and Monica Zeringue. The show is presented by the St. Tammany Art Association and sponsored by Walter Mader and Catherine Deano, former STAA president, longtime supporter and co-founder of the Painting with a Twist family of studios.

Witnessing the absence of proper Twelfth Night merrymaking on the Northshore, the St. John Fools of Misrule was formed to announce the arrival of the Carnival season to St. Tammany Parish. The organization's rituals are derived from an ancient English men's group that clamored along the evening streets creating unruliness with cowbells and whips while delivering jeers and spankings to those caught on the street unaware. The Fools of Misrule integrated into its name homage to the historic St. John District of old Covington (1813) where the group was founded and annually conducts its bawdy procession.

On January 11th, the St. John's Fools of Misrule begin the festivities with the "Feast of Fools" (for Fool & Jewel members only) from 4 pm to 6 pm at the Seiler Bar and courtyard.

The Twelfth Night Street March begins at 6:30 pm in front of the Columbia Street Tap Room at the corner of North Columbia Street and East Lockwood Street.

Cooking Instructions:

Heat the water in a soup pot. Once the water is boiling, add the oil, salt, pepper, cayenne and paprika. Basically, just mince all ingredients, place it all in the soup and bring to a boil. I use a larger amount of parsley and cilantro (1/2 a cup to 1 cup, chopped), so I add this in with the veggies. Add the chopped ginger root as well. After the soup is back to a boil, it may be turned down to a simmer and cooked to preference. When the soup is ready to serve, turn off the flame and stir in the remaining herbs. Serve with your favorite bread.

The revelers then proceed south on East New Hampshire Street, cross Boston Street and turn left onto Walker Alley. There the group stops to enjoy oysters on the half shell from Buster's Place and beverages from The Boston Pub and The Green Room.

From there the revelers proceed left onto North Columbia Street and cross Boston Street. The next stop is Winos & Tacos for refreshments in the courtyard. The marchers continue on to the Rock N Blues Café for more refreshments. Finally, the procession culminates with a party at the Columbia Street Tap Room and Seiler Bar into the night.

Trees may be dropped off between the hours of 7:30am - 3:30pm Monday through Friday. Trees for RECYCLING must be green with no artificial decorations/ adornments attached.



On Wednesday, January 22nd & 29th, all Christmas trees that are unable to be recycled which include trees that are flocked or have lights, tinsel, or any other attachments unnatural to the tree can be put out and collected curbside with regular trash pickup
