Her dramatic paintings are filled with mood and colors that reflect her passionate response to the beauty that abounds here. Her brush strokes mimic the excitement and energy she feels as she captures the beauty she sees in the wetlands. Louisiana's haunting swamps and bayous are filled with inspiration for this local artist. Her love of our vanishing wetlands prompted her to develop a project called Marsh Mission, in collaboration with C.C. Lockwood. Their bestselling book "Marsh Mission: Capturing the Vanishing Wetlands" documented their artistic journey through Louisiana's waterways.


Rhea Gary is a Louisiana native, and award winning artist. She holds Bachelor of Science and Masters of Fine Arts degrees from Louisiana State University in Baton Rouge. She also studied at the New Orleans Academy of Fine Arts. Her works are held in museum collections, in the Louisiana State Capitol, Louisiana Governor's Mansion, Louisiana State University, and the American Embassies in Australia, Bahrain, Jordan, and Venezuela and in many individual and corporate collections. Her work has been published in several magazines including Louisiana Life, American Artist, Art & Antiques, and numerous regional journals. She has been featured on television on CBS Sunday Mornings, Delta Hands, and Louisiana Public Broadcasting. In 2007, 2009, and 2010 she was voted 'Best Visual Artist' in the Best of 225 Awards by the readers of 225 Magazine, a publication of the Greater Baton Rouge Metropolitan Area. In February 2010 she was Country Roads Magazine's Readers Choice-Favorite Local Artist. In July 2011 she was named Louisiana Art Legend by Forum 35, an organization of young leaders. The widespread distribution of her work allows people everywhere to share in her joyful artistic statement of love for the places she paints.

"Stitched" Showing At The St. Tammany Art Association

STAA is proud to present an exhibition of work by artists Christine Sauer and Laura Gipson. The common thread between these two contemporary artists is that they incorporate the technique of stitching in their work. Both are very different in their approach and use of materials.

An intuitive and improvisational approach to working with materials and image characterizes Christine Sauer's diverse body of work. Her imaginative art is inspired by nature, science, the cosmos and an enjoyment of the process of making. For many years she created and exhibited her paintings, collages and sculptural installations in New Orleans and around the country. Recently, Christine has incorporated her fascination with stitching and textiles into her studio practice.

Laura Gipson draws upon common human experiences as her source material. The work attempts to make visible the inner invisible experience. Utilizing imagery of familiar objects that serve to function as stand-ins for the body and/or the mind, her work is built in an additive process, either through construction or layering. Gipson's work is constructed in layers, with the waxed outer surface presenting a scarred surface that implies that this object has a history: that it has lived a life. In much of the work, She uses everyday materials that do much to keep these objects in the realm of common experience. These "stand-ins" function as an individual in the midst of life. What we know about these individuals is either written on their skin or we can see it through their facade.

Farmer's Market Recipes Fresh recipes inspired by ingredients found at the **Covington Farmer's Market Roasted Butternut Squash**

Ingredients:

1 butternut squash 6 cloves of garlic sm. bunch of parsley sm. bunch of cilantro tblsp olive oil salt and pepper to taste



Heat oven to 400 degrees. Cut the squash in half lengthwise. Scoop out the seeds and strings. (You may season these up with oil and spices and bake them along with the squash if you like). Peel or cut the skin from the squash and cut into one inch cubes. Throw into a mixing bowl. Mince the garlic, parsley and cilantro and toss into the bowl. Add the olive oil and spices and mix until evenly coated.

Place the mixture into a glass baking dish and cover. Bake for half an hour. Remove the cover and stir around, making sure nothing is sticking to the pan. Bake for an additional 10 - 15 minutes, or until squash is nicely browned and soft.

Cut and clean snap beans. Chop tomatoes, garlic, onion, carrots and herbs. Place ingredients in crock pot with 4 - 6 cups water (cut with stock if you prefer, or just season to taste).
