CPD: Police Recruits Graduate Academy

Chief Tim Lentz is proud to announce the graduation of seven recruits from police academy. In keeping with his promise to fill the ranks of the Covington Police Department from an all-time low staffing level, these new recruits will go directly to the patrol division to complete their field training and become solo police officers protecting the citizens of Covington. Filling vacant police officer positions is not a quick process and the graduation of these officers is a major step toward completing that goal. New officers must undergo a rigorous background check, physical and mental fitness tests, complete a police academy and pass a field-training program before they can be released to work as solo officers.

The seven police officers that graduated this morning attended the St. Tammany Parish Sheriff's Office P.O.S.T. (Peace Officer Standards and Training) Level I Academy, which began in October of last year.

They began their 16 week field training program last Friday, working with certified training officers in the patrol division to get hands-on experience. Upon completion of the field-training program, they will be assigned to positions in the patrol division.

The CPD has two additional recruits in the Slidell Police Academy, leaving only one more open position within the police department. Chief Lentz made the following statement, "We are proud of these officers for graduating the academy and excelling while doing so. This will bring us another step closer to our goal of a fully staffed police department. I would also like to thank Sheriff Strain for allowing these officers to attend his POST Academy.

Covington Man Killed in Tragic Accident

Shortly after 5:00 pm on Sunday January 25th, Covington Police Officers responded to an accident involving a motorized skateboard in the 300 block of Boston Street that claimed the life of 31 year old Jerry Siles Jr. of Covington.

Preliminary investigations revealed that a ScooterX 49cc gas powered skateboard driven by Mr. Siles was traveling westbound on Boston Street when, for reasons still under investigation, Mr. Siles lost control and was thrown from the skateboard. Mr. Siles was not wearing a helmet and sustained critical injuries. Mr. Siles was transported to St. Tammany Parish Hospital and later transferred to North Oaks Medical Center, where he succumbed to his injuries. Impairment is unknown and toxicology results are pending an autopsy.

Multiple websites advertise the SkaterX 49cc gas powered skateboard capable of reaching speeds of up to 37 miles per hour and not approved for use on public roadways. The use of DOT approved helmets saves lives. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, helmet use is approximately 37% effective in preventing motorcycle deaths and 67% effective in preventing brain injuries.

The accident remains under investigation and additional details will be released as they are made available. Any witnesses to the incident are asked to call the Covington Police Department at (985)892-8500 or CrimeStoppers at (504)822-1111.

Farmer's Market Recipe: Minestrone Soup

Fresh recipes inspired by local ingredients found at the Covington Farmer's Market

Celebrate National Hot Soup Month with this delicious winter minestrone. This is a good slow-cook soup to warm up the kitchen on those cold days.

Ingredients:

1 cup of mixed dried beans

- 1 medium yellow or sweet onion, chopped
- 2 cups chopped carrots
- 2 celery stalks, chopped 1 cup raw green beans, cleaned
- 1 clove of garlic, minced
- 2 cups chopped tomatoes 2 cups of vegetable stock olive oil
- 1 cup of ditalini pasta or shell pasta
- 1 cup chopped zucchini
- 1 cup chopped fresh Swiss chard
- 2 tablespoons of tomato paste
- fresh basil, oregano, and thyme, chopped

Cooking Instructions:

Saute the onions and carrots with oil in a large soup pot over medium heat for about five minutes. Add the garlic and continue to simmer for another minute. Season with a little salt and pepper.

Add the stock and beans, and bring to a boil. Reduce heat to a simmer, and add the celery. Cook on low heat for about two hours.

Add the green beans, tomatoes, zucchini, fresh chard and herbs. Cook for about another 30 minutes.

Add pasta and tomato paste. Increase the heat slightly but do not boil - the pasta will take a little longer to cook, about thirty minutes. You may want to add a little water at this point. Serve when the pasta is cooked with a little fresh grated parmesan, and a fresh sprig of basil for garnish if you like.




