"Rainbows On My Ceiling" Available Locally Covington Native Patricia Clanton's Most Recent Book

february 11 - 17, 2015

"Rainbows on my Ceiling" is a collection of poetry and photography by Mrs. Patricia Clanton, a Covington native and life-long resident whose family has a rich history in this area. Mrs. Clanton's parents, Mr Sidney Fuhrmann and Mrs. Pauline Frederick Fuhrmann were both notable Covington citizens. Mr. Fuhrmann being most known for his support of the arts with the management of several theaters in Covington and across the parish. Mrs Clanton has also spent a lifetime serving Covington; as the first



female City Council member she was instrumental in the restoration of the 1920 brick pillars at the entrance to Bogue Falaya Park and the Arch at the Parish Fairgrounds, both major attractions to Covington.

Mrs. Clanton was heavily influenced by her mother and grandmother, both avid diarists, keeping journals of their travels and experiences that are now in Mrs. Clanton's possession. She later transcribed these journals, sharing their stories in oral history interviews and the books "The Family Circle of Pauline & Sidney: the Fuhrmann Family' and "A Potpourri of Memories: Growing up in Covington", all of which are available at the St. Tammany Parish Library Covington Branch. "I feel it is important to leave memories behind for the next generations - otherwise you become just a dash between your birth and death date," she said in an interview for this article.

"Rainbows on my Ceiling" had a different purpose. This book includes poetry spanning many years, ranging from whimsical to philosophical. While collecting her works Mrs. Clanton began taking photographs she felt gave a physical representation of the concepts she covers in her poetry. "Rainbows on my Ceiling" presents her poetry and photography seamlessly, creating a compilation that is both sentimental and inspiring. Cont. below

Downtown Traffic Study Underway



Seeking ways to improve traffic flow and safety in the historic CBD, Covington Mayor Mike Cooper requested the Regional Planning Commission last year to conduct a comprehensive study of traffic circulation, parking options, and safety analysis in partnership with the City. This key project is now underway.

A team of consultants led by Digital Engineering, including ITS Regional, Inc. and Dana Brown & Associates, was selected and will be collecting and analyzing traffic and related data in the weeks to come. The goal is to recommend new or improved policies to enhance traffic flow, parking, signage, signals, and safety for all transportation modes, including bicyclists and The University of New Orleans pedestrians. Transportation Institute will also provide additional analysis support as needed.

Among the areas to be studied include possible traffic signalization on E. Boston St. at N. Vermont St., the enhancement of E. Kirkland St. through the Village Walk from N. Lee Rd. to Collins Blvd., and streetscaping of E. Gibson St. for clear identification of bicycle lanes. In addition, the study will consist of evaluation and conceptual development of an overall traffic circulation plan and parking management analysis.

In an effort to determine the current conditions and develop improvements, the consultants will observe parking and traffic patterns, collect data, and seek input from our business owners and those who frequent downtown," Mayor Mike Cooper. "I am anxious to receive the final recommendations so that we may take immediate steps to improve travel safety and movement, enhance the flow of traffic in and out of our City, which will contribute significantly to the pedestrian-friendly environment of our historic downtown."

The final report, which is expected to be completed by June 2015, will include a series of action items the City of Covington may consider for implementation.

Sheriff Warns Parish Of New Phone Scam

A new phone scam targeting the elderly has been reported to the Sheriff's office by various residents over the past

The basic technique of the caller is similar to other scams we've reported recently. The caller makes some sort of threat against the person answering the phone and demands a cash payment to resolve the problem.

In this latest scam, the recipient of the call is told that a relative is being held hostage and will not be released until money is either wired via Western Union or a "Green Dot" card is obtained from a local retail outlet.

Green Dot cards are financial instruments that can be preloaded with funds, which are retrievable by anyone who has been given the code imprinted on the card.

Other recent scams have involved callers falsely claiming the victim has a warrant for their arrest or owes a large sum of money to the IRS for unpaid taxes. The callers may identify themselves as Sheriff's deputies or other government agents.

We want to remind our residents again that the Sheriff's office DOES NOT initiate phone calls such as these. Anyone who receives a call similar to these, or is in any way suspicious of a call from someone demanding an immediate cash payment, is asked to call the Sheriff's office.

"The scammers making these calls are committing the worst type of fraud imaginable - preying on the elderly," Sheriff Jack Strain said. "Unfortunately, almost all of these calls are originating from overseas. The best way we can protect our residents is to educate them and encourage them to call us if they are at all suspicious," Strain said. www.stpso.com

Farmer's Market Recipe Bison Meatballs & Spaghetti for Two

Fresh recipes inspired by local ingredients found at the Covington Farmer's Market

Ingredients- Meatballs:

1lb ground Bison 1 large egg

1/2 onion, finely chopped

1/2 cup plain bread crumbs 3tbsp Italian seasonings -

oregano, thyme, fresh parsley 3tbsp minced fresh garlic 1tsp course salt 1tsp fresh ground black pepper 1tsp Worcestershire sauce

Red Sauce:

4 oz tomato paste 1 large tomato, diced 1/2 onion, finely chopped 3tbsp minced fresh garlic 3tbsp Italian seasonings oregano, thyme, basil

2tbsp raw sugar 1tbsp balsamic vinegar 1tsp chili pepper 1tbsp olive oil 1/4 cup of water

Cooking Instructions:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In a large mixing bowl, combine all meatball ingredients. Mix well with your hands, then devide into small balls and place in an oiled cookie tray, making sure to leave space between them. Makes about 16 small meatballs. Bake for 15 minutes. If making larger meatballs, bake for 30 minutes.

Red Sauce – In a large saucepan or medium pot, cook the onions & garlic first with the olive oil. Add the herbs and spices, stir, then mix in the rest of the ingredients. Bring to a boil, then lower to medium heat. Add the cooked meatballs and simmer for about 15 minutes. Serve over your favorite spaghetti, top with fresh grated parmesan!
